Dear Mrs. Bacon,

I am writing following my visit on Wednesday, 23rd May 2018 to thank you and all the staff and children for the very warm welcome and for arranging my visit so that it was so enjoyable and positive. Thank you for giving me so much of your time; as usual it was a joy to visit you all. I do hope that you managed some rest and recuperation during the Whitsun break....hopefully the voice will return!

It was great to hear about the recent SIAMS Monitoring Review Visit by Alison Lock. Her report is very positive and highlights all the strengths of the school and the ways that it could encompass new initiatives and enhance its already excellent provision as a distinctly Christian school. Hearing that R.E. assessment has become included into the whole school approach to assessment and recording is very heartening.

I always enjoy the tour of the school; it was lovely to see children and adults enthusiastically engaged in a variety of activities, many connected with some imaginatively explored and developed topics. All the classrooms were buzzing and even though the upper KS2 children were out of school on a well-deserved PGL activity...their classroom bore signs of celebrated work on display.

The Spiritual Garden is well maintained and the additional work on planting and laminated butterflies on the Prayer Tree is creating a very special place for quiet reflection. The butterfly release in the garden must have been a wonderful experience for the children with herbs and scented flowers adding to the atmosphere.

The Christian Values programme is thoroughly embedded in all that you do and it was lovely to see you respond so enthusiastically to a few new ideas to link the Values to life out of school. I have no doubt that you will embrace the idea and make a wonderful display of the Home-School link around your Values board.

Your links with the local Church are well established and you work hard to promote creative links to strengthen the work between the Church and the school. This team work approach is evident with staff in school having a mutually agreed ethos. Changes in teaching staff throughout the year have been well managed and the school has remained strong and clear in its vision.

I enjoyed looking at the Reflection Areas and Prayer Spaces and hearing how one pupil has been given the responsibility of lighting the child friendly candles in the jars to support good behaviour. An example, I think, of the caring, inclusive approach at Haresfield and good evidence of how the school is distinctly Christian.
