- Joint activities with parents develops independent creative expression in older children.


Our aim...

These skills are known as intelligences

- We all have strengths and areas for development within these.
- We believe that children should be exposed to learning which is relevant to all these 'intelligences' to identify and challenge their strengths whilst developing new ways of learning.



Weekly tasks



- We hope that many of the tasks will provide opportunities for families to share this learning journey and encourage siblings to learn together.
- Tasks will be given out on a Wednesday and returned to school the following Tuesday.

Marking and feedback


 This will be through shared classroom discussions and feedback from peers

Bringing work into school



There will be dedicated time and space for the children to share their work and achievements with a chance to share with their class and opportunities for work to be shared in Friday worship. We will set up a notice board to share the work with others.

Most important, parents and carers are asked to:

- make it clear to pupils how much they value homework and support the school in explaining how it can help their learning
- praise and encourage pupils when they take pride in their homework
- encourage pupils of all ages to read as much and as widely as possible
